
Education

The rolling hills, incredible hot springs and other natural features that characterize the topography and geology of the Biei and Kamifurano area are the result of the volcanic activity of Mt. Tokachi and other volcanoes in the area. Thanks to a variety of efforts to overcome both the hilly terrain and disaster brought about by volcanic mudflows (caused by the eruption of Mt. Tokachi in 1926), the area now enjoys abundant agricultural



production.

Such examples illustrate how the land, ecosystem and human activity affect each other to form this incredible area. It is lessons like these that make Tokachidake Geopark so appealing.
